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TOTAL FIXED ASSET BASE




Washington County is located in northwestern Maryland, bordered by Pennsylvania to the north and West Virginia to the south. It is bordered on the east by Frederick County, Maryland and on the west by Allegany County, Maryland. Washington County is approximately 70 miles from Washington, D.C. and Baltimore, Maryland. Two major highways, Interstate 81 – running north and south, and Interstate 70 – running east and west, cross within Washington County's borders. The County is a body corporate and politic and is a mid-size, multi-service local government serving the needs of approximately 155,590 residents with nine incorporated municipalities. Under public local law both the executive and legislative functions of the County are vested in the elected, five-member Board of County Commissioners of Washington County. The County Commissioners are elected on a county-wide basis and serve four-year terms. Other elected County funded positions include County Sheriff, Treasurer, and State's Attorney.

Information provided below indicates where Washington County ranks within Maryland Counties for the services and statistics provided among 23 counties and Baltimore City for FY2022, the most recent available year.

#### **FINANCIAL STATS**






Washington County will spend approximately \$357 million annually on public services in FY2024. The General Fund budget represents the County's largest fund at \$296.1 million, or 82.9%. Major revenues that make up the General Fund budget are Property Tax, Local Income Tax, and Other Local Taxes including Recordation Tax, Service Fees, and Intergovernmental Grants. General Fund dollars are spent on Education, Public Safety, Debt Service, General Government, Courts, State Agencies, Community Programs, Public Works, Parks & Recreation, and sometimes support other funds through an intergovernmental transfer.


#### MAJOR REVENUE TRENDS

The following information summarizes key revenue sources that affect the County's overall financial condition. External economic factors such as the unemployment rate, inflation and interest rates, and real property sales impact County revenues. Amounts reported reflect distributions received as of the reported date. The revenue graphs to the right reflect total actual revenues collected for each of the prior fiscal years and the projected total annual revenue based on existing trends for the current year.




The table to the left compares major year-to-date expenditure activity to budgeted funding. It incorporates the variance by dollar and percentage, along with total expenditure activity. Funds expended and encumbered should average around 50% if not subject to seasonal fluctuation.

#### FISCAL & ECONOMIC UPDATE


The first distribution of income tax quarterly withholdings for FY24 was received in November (July, August, and September 2023 withholdings) totaling \$22.8 million, a decrease of \$0.1 million from the comparative FY23 distribution, and is \$1.1 million less than budgeted. Tax Year 2023 withholdings declined by 0.7% and estimated payments declined by 9.0% from the prior tax year. The County also received a reconciling distribution of \$6.8 million in November, which was \$4.0 million more than budgeted. The current fiscal year is the first year where the full impact of changes in the tax rate from 3.0% to 2.95% will be recognized in distributions to the County. Personal Property tax receipts YTD are 29% higher than the prior fiscal year representing steady growth in personal property tax receipts.

The county unemployment rate at the end of December was 2.2% compared to 3.7% nationwide. Permits issued for new residential homes in Washington County have decreased by almost -19% through December when compared to the prior fiscal year. The total number of homes sold through December 2023 decreased by -7.5% (from 957 to 885) from December of 2022. Housing prices have continued to increase with YTD average sales up \$26,680, or 8.8%, from the previous year. As interest rates along with housing prices remain elevated, home sales will likely continue to decline due to the increased cost for borrowers. The housing market remains competitive with demand outpacing supply of homes, despite high prices and interest rates. The median days a home was on the market in Washington County was 20 and 9 for December of 2023 and 2022 respectively.
