#### Grading Plan Submittal Requirements Frequently Asked Questions

#### When is a Grading Plan review required?

When total disturbed area is greater than 5000 square feet or total disturbed volume is greater than 100 cubic yards.

#### Are there any exemptions to the Grading Plan requirements?

Exemptions include residential landscaping and agricultural activities.

#### What types of grading plans can be submitted?

There are Two Types – Standard Grading Plan or Site Specific Grading Plan.

#### When can a Standard Grading Plan be submitted?

Standard Grading Plan can be used when:

- less than 30,000 square feet or 1,000 cubic yards of volume disturbed.
- A Single family or duplex residential development.

#### What must be included in a Standard Grading Plan review application?

- All Standard Grading Plan review applications require a submittal checklist form, 2 sets of plans, cover letter and any fees required.
- All items required per the Standard Grading Plan must be shown on the Standard Grading Plan Submittal.
- (3) copies of the plan, application form completed and signed. Must be submitted with permit application.

#### Where is the Grading Plan review application to be submitted?

- All <u>Site Specific Grading Plan</u> review applications shall be submitted to the Washington County Division of Plan Review & Permitting.
- All <u>Standard Grading Plan</u> applications shall be submitted to the Washington County Division of Plan Review & Permitting.

# If I am applying for a Standard Grading Plan submittal, do I still need to apply for a Standard Erosion and Sediment Control Plan?

The Standard ESC plan requirements shall be included as part of the Standard Grading Plan.

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#### What must be included in a Site Specific Grading Plan review application?

- A Site Specific Grading Plan can be submitted either as a: Site Plan, Construction Drawings, or Site Specific Grading Plan.
- All Site Plan and Construction Drawing submittal requirements must be included with these submittals.
- All Site Specific Grading Plan review applications require a minimum of a submittal checklist, (3) sets of plans, computations, cover letter and any fees required.
- For Site Specific Grading Plan submittals, all items included on the Site Specific Grading Plan Checklist must be shown on the Site Specific Grading Plan.

#### When is a SWM Exemption Review required?

If disturbance is greater than 5000 square feet on the site and applicant wishes to submit a standard grading plan or apply for a SWM waiver.

#### When can a Grading Certification Be Used?

- All projects constructed under a Standard Grading Plan require submittal of a Grading Certification.
- All projects constructed under a Standard SWM Plan or under a Site Specific Grading Plan for residential construction for individual single family lots not part of a Site Plan or Construction Drawing may submit a Grading Certification in lieu of meeting standard inspection and as-built requirements for SWM.

#### When is a Grading Certification submittal required?

A Grading Certification signed and sealed by a Qualified Professional must be received by the Washington County Division of Construction prior to use and occupancy permit approval.
