To Bidders:

This Addendum is hereby made a part of the Contract Documents on which all bids will be based and is issued to correct and clarify the original documents.

Please acknowledge receipt of this Addendum at the appropriate space on the Proposal Form. This Addendum consists of six (6) pages.

NOTE: All Proposers must enter the Washington County Administration Complex through either the front door at the 100 West Washington Street entrance or through the rear entrance (w/blue canopy roof) which is handicap accessible and must use the elevator to access the Purchasing Department to submit their proposal and/or to attend the Pre-Proposal Conference. Alternate routes are controlled by a door access system. The general public will be subject to wand search and will be required to remove any unauthorized items from the building prior to entry. Prohibited items include but are not limited to: Weapons of any type; Firearms, ammunition, and explosive devices; Cutting instruments of any type - including knives, scissors, box cutters, work tools, knitting needles, or anything with a cutting edge, etc.; Pepper spray, mace, or any other chemical defense sprays; and Illegal substances.

ITEM NO. 1: <u>Inquiry</u>: Please reconfirm the due date for this procurement by providing it in response to answers to questions.

<u>Response</u>: Proposals are due no later than 4:00 P.M. (EDT/EST), Wednesday, February 7, 2024

ITEM NO. 2: <u>Inquiry</u>: What is the date by which you will answer these questions?

<u>Response</u>: These questions will be addressed no later than Wednesday, January 17, 2024.

ITEM NO. 3: <u>Inquiry</u>: Is there a deadline for questions?

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<u>Response</u>: All necessary interpretations will be issued to all Proposers in the form of addenda to the specifications, and such addenda shall become part of the contract documents. Requests received after 4:00 P.M. (EDT/EST), Tuesday, January 23, 2024, may not be considered.

ITEM NO. 4: <u>Inquiry</u>: When is the anticipated award date?

Response: It is anticipated that the start date will tentatively begin late February 2024

ITEM NO. 5: <u>Inquiry</u>: Can you please provide greater explanation of your expectations related to any required subcontracting to minority-owned, women-owned, or other types or categories of small or disadvantaged businesses? For example, what is required with the proposal, and what is required to comply during the term of the contract?

<u>Response</u>: 11,819.

ITEM NO. 29: <u>Inquiry</u>: What were your transports per year for advanced life support emergency level 2 for last year or for the last 12 months?

Response: 1,558.

ITEM NO. 30: <u>Inquiry</u>: What were your transports per year for basic life support for last year or for the last 12 months?

Response: 8,860 (BLS P3).

<u>Response</u>: We cannot break out emergency and non-emergency by category, but we can tell you emergency was 4,468 and non-emergency was 16,254.
